2020 has certainly been an unforgettable year for many of us. While Australia is still recovering from one of its worst bushfires in decades, Australia and the world is also experiencing the effects of the worst pandemic in the century – the COVID-19. Despite all these, MM&M has been able to continue to reach out to people in Nepal, India, Cambodia, East Asia and Papua New Guinea, to provide food aid, medical services, student aid and shelters for those in need. MM&M continues to carry out our mission and share our values with the people we reach out to.

We are in the second year of our 5-year plan. Children and widows are often marginalised in society. MM&M has two projects that aim to help the local community to overcome poverty. The Girls' Home in Kathmandu is currently in its first stage of registration with government. The Bezalel House of Crafts & Arts (BHOCA), in India is planning to take its first batch of students in 2021.

With the COVID-19 pandemic, many workers in India, Nepal and Cambodia lost their jobs instantaneously. As the pandemic is still not under-control, many families face a new challenge – starvation due to poverty. MM&M started the COVID-19 food aid project in these three countries and has helped more than 400 families to date.

Although we are still in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, MM&M is looking forward to achieving our 5-year plan over the next 3 years. In today's world, there are too many injustices, especially in less privileged regions. Each individual is created by God and thus every lives matter. MM&M endeavour to help and will continue to help the world to be a better place. Blessed are those who give than to receive.

CAMBODIA

Just like many countries around the world, the pandemic has caused social and economic impacts affecting Cambodians both physically and mentally. It has further burdened the already poor communities and brought the country into greater turmoil.

Cambodia, as well as surrounding countries, initially went into months of lockdown to control community transmission, leading to the eventual collapse of tourism, manufacturing and the construction industry. Even when the country's border restriction was lifted and people started to return to their normal daily life activities, life has not been the same. Many factories have shut down and remained shut due to high taxes in export/import trading.

As most Cambodians receive daily wages, their inability to find sustainable job resulted in difficulty to provide food on the table for their families. MM&M has partnered with the local church pastored by Rev. Nov Phouen where 4 cycles of essential food pack consisting of rice, noodles, oil, salt and canned fish has been provided through the Food Aid project. So far, 113 poor families have benefited from this project. Our local partner is now exploring strategies to help the families to gain self-sustaining income through livestock farming.

We are so thankful for all the donors who have contributed generously to this food aid project.

INDIA

COVID- 19 is a global pandemic that has wreaked havoc and affected all countries in different ways. This especially rings true for the country of India. Strict lockdown to control the spread of virus means many villagers are struggling to survive day to day with no income, as most of them are farmers. MM&M has partnered with local pastor, Pastor Biju to provide food relief kits to those poor, widows and people who are starving.

Since this food aid project has been initiated, over 650 families have been helped and supported. Sarah* a 12-year-old girl, who tragically lost both parents at a young age lives with her uncle and aunty whose daily income has been lost due to the strict lockdown. Consequently, Sarah often has no food for days. With the food aid project, she has received staples to keep her nourished.

Thank you for partnering with us in this project through your generous donations. In contributing to India COVID-19 food relief project, you give a glimmer of hope and potentially plant seeds of faith to turn their eyes to the true giver of light and life.

NEPAL

Since Nepal reported its first case of COVID-19 in January 2020, the whole country has been locked down for the past 4 months. Many businesses and constructions were forced to close down. In the first week of the lockdown, more than 200,000 migrant workers left Kathmandu to go home. The lockdown has caused more than 60% of unemployment and the average income has fallen by 90%. This loss of income has greatly impacted the workers and their families as they were already struggling with day-to-day living with daily wages prior to the pandemic.

In Kathmandu, many construction workers and their families have been struggling to get food on the table every day. Those that have been affected include students from outside of Kathmandu, people with disabilities and large families. Situations in isolated hill areas like Mugu is not any better. The lockdown and reduced business activities have affected people living in Mugu. MM&M, through our local partner (Gospel for Nepal), has been able to reach out to them to provide immediate food relief. MM&M distributed essential items like rice, dahl, oil, potatoes and hygiene products such as soaps for those affected. Since June 2020, MM&M has helped more than 27 families in Kathmandu and many more in the Mugu area.

Recently, the COVID-19 food aid project has also been extended to help more families in other villages. The main challenge MM&M is facing now is how to help these families to overcome their financial struggle in the future due to the long-term impact caused by COVID-19.


As the world is struggling to control the spread of this virus, MM&M has been called to support the people in Nepal and to share the love with those vulnerable groups during this pandemic period.

HOUSE OF RESURRECTION [CAMBODIA]

MM&M, together with Rev. Nov Phoeun and his family, is providing daily care to 14 children from the age of 6 to 21 in the House of Resurrection. Fulfilling the most basic living needs are essential as planting a good seed of love in these children's hearts. MM&M believes that raising a child with love can make a great impact in the society.

Your donation has changed their lives forever. They are the precious children from very poor and single-parent families, some with learning difficulties. Because of your generosity, they're well fed, able to learn to read and write, and grow and develop with love. A child living under the roof of love is a blessed one. GENESIS CARE CENTRE [GIRL'S HOME, NEPAL]

Nepal is among the poorest country in the world. Many families, including young children, are forced to work at very young age so that they can put food on their table. As for these children, their basic needs (including education) are often overlooked.

Hence, Genesis Care Centre seeks to provide both a physical and spiritual shelter for the under-privileged girls particularly in Kathmandu. It hopes to provide equal opportunities in education, lodging, encouragement, love and warmth to the less fortunate with the aim of providing them a better future. This project is currently in its initial stages as planning and preparations are disrupted by the pandemic.

MERCY FIELD HOME [EAST ASIA]

Mercy Field Home (MFH) is currently home to 17 orphans with disabilities such as cerebral palsy, intellectual disability, and autism.

By conducting therapies at MFH, the children can incorporate their newly learned skills in their everyday life where they can begin to meet their developmental milestones.

We are immensely grateful to our special education teachers who have put lot of effort to design individualised learning programs to meet each child's special needs based on their unique conditions. Each one of them is progressing in their own capacity in areas such as muscle training, social skills, language skills and cognitive skills. Remarkable improvements from each child have proven how significant the role of the special education teachers play in their therapy.

Staff at MFH also play an integral role as they inspire, motivate, and incorporate skills taught in therapy with their activities of daily living. The learning and training of these special needs children need to be carried out continuously, as they need more time and effort to improve and grow when compared to their normal peers. Due to the COVID19 restrictions, special education teachers are unable to complete therapies at MFH. However, our MFH wonderful staff have been continuing to support these children with great care and loving attention.

We are so grateful for every donation and sponsorship, and we hope that we can continue to count on your support. Please keep praying for our partner, both during this crisis and going forward, as they work to adapt their program so they may continue to be part of the stories of lives being transformed and hope being restored.

NEPAL

In 2019-2020, there were a total 55 students who received the student sponsorhsip. 29 primary school students, 10 lower secondary school students, 6 higher secondary students and 10 university students.

WOMEN'S UPLIFT PROJECT

MM&M Women's
Uplift Project works to
support impoverished
women by delivering
essential life skills,
knowledge and
confidence as a

self-sustenance

MM&M is excited at the inauguration of Bezalel House of Crafts & Arts (BHOCA) in Warangal, India, despite a turbulent year of tackling the pandemic that has severely crippled the poorest communities in the country. BHOCA is a newly registered tailoring skill training centre set up for the underprivileged women of Oorungonda village and surrounding villages.

Majority of the Oorungonda men spend a third of their income on alcohol and cheap spirits leading to high mortality rate, leaving behind wife and children with little to survive. These 'untouchable' class widows are mostly illiterate and lack of basic self-sustaining abilities. BHOCA's aim is to empower these women by teaching them valuable sewing skills and equipping them for the market or workplace to be in a position to self-support.

Currently under renovation, BHOCA centre is scheduled to complete at the end of 2020. The building of BHOCA has seen a season of scorching summer heat to heavy monsoon floods, to the painful loss of BHOCA's local project supervisor to COVID-19. It has been an extremely challenging journey. Despite the blood, sweat and tears, BHOCA persevered and laboured on with a goal to have the centre ready for its purpose in 2021.

MM&M deeply appreciates the commitment and zeal shown by the local partners and is looking forward to BHOCA opening its door to her first batch of students in 2021.




Due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 where there are restrictions on international travels, all the medical trips were suspended.


















JOURNEY

Not just their physical condition but He also touched their souls that are longed to be saved. That reminds me of what we are doing in our medical camps.

My journey to Nepal, was fruitful and full of blessings. Seeing the people in Nepal, who are the friendliest, welcomed everyone with their best hospitality. It was also a spiritual walk along with God throughout the journey. He showed His love for me from the day I was born, and now He showed me His love not just for me, but also for people in Nepal. Although they are less fortunate, but God has blessed them with the richness of love, and their simple-minded love for Him too.

I'm sure I wouldn't be able to experience this when I wasn't ready. But God has revealed Himself differently, to each of us, and I'm glad He did, through this journey.


COUNTRY

Many women in PNG die every year due to pregnancy or childbirth. An estimated 40% of women do not give birth in a health centre or hospital, putting them at greater risk of complications. Many of these women live in remote areas where health centre could be many hours of walk away. Thousands of newborns also die every year, and thousands more that survive birth do not make it to their fifth birthday.

MM&M has been collaborating with Tian En Methodist Church in Port Moresby, PNG since 2016. We focus on creating a more equal world for women, girls and children by improving access to health services, health information and providing support in education (in future), as well as taking part in local decision-making in their family. We also work with communities and families, encouraging positive attitudes and behaviours towards women.

MM&M is also involved in both medical primary care and short-term mission field projects that address many of PNG's critical health access problems and quality health care services.

Together with Tian En Methodist Church, PNG, we focus on providing better health services, education and training support for the next generation.




